

LOCAL PATENTS

Anyone can apply for a patent. First they have to have an original idea. To protect their idea from intrusion, they must secure it with a patent. That is not an easy task. In addition to writing about the item, a seeker must have a series of drawings to accompany their application as well as a working model of their idea. Mount Pleasant citizens hold hundreds of US Patents on a variety of inventions most related to coal, coke, glass, and transportation. Here are a few of the early patents.


